His method was radical: daily maximal squatting, five days a week, with meticulous periodization, recovery tracking, and subjective feedback loops. This was not hypertrophy for aesthetics, nor

powerlifting for competition medals—it was a systemic exploration of neuromuscular efficiency, connective tissue resilience, and metabolic sustainability. His early journals, preserved in private archives, reveal a mind obsessed with variables: bar path angles, ground reaction forces, cortical response thresholds, and the subtle interplay between central nervous system fatigue and muscular regeneration. This period coincided with a geopolitical shift in strength sports: the post-2010 fragmentation of powerlifting federations, the rise of CrossFit’s functional paradigm, and a growing skepticism toward pharmaceutical performance enhancement. Gregory positioned himself at the intersection—rejecting both the sterile rigidity of Olympic lifting and the hyper-specialized extremes of modern powerlifting. His daily squat regimen became a living experiment: a scalable, repeatable model grounded in functional anatomy rather than competition-driven maximalism.

MusclePharm Barbell: From Underground Mythos to Institutional Influence

Gregory’s ascent was catalyzed by MusclePharm Barbell, a brand born in the early 2000s from the underground anabolic community as a purveyor of hardcore, no-nonsense supplements. Initially a fringe label, MusclePharm gained credibility through its commitment to purity, scientific transparency, and community-driven validation—values that resonated with a generation disillusioned by synthetic shortcuts. When Gregory aligned with MusclePharm, it was not a mere endorsement, but a strategic fusion of practical application and brand narrative. His daily squat sessions—recorded in grainy VHS-style footage shared on private forums and later integrated into MusclePharm’s educational content—were framed not as performance hacks, but as biomechanical case studies. Gregory’s approach emphasized “consistent overload without compromise,” using a blend of back squats, front squats, and variations like the deficit squat to target different phases of the lift cycle. He advocated for progressive tension through tempo manipulation, partial reps for neural potentiation, and isometric holds to reinforce joint integrity—methods that aligned with emerging research on eccentric loading and muscle fiber recruitment. Controversies and Risks: The Shadow of Overtraining

The daily squat model, for all its discipline, is not without peril. Gregory’s early phase—documented in his infamous “12-week crash log”—revealed the dangers of pushing without adequate recovery. He experienced persistent shoulder impingement, lumbar strain, and a temporary drop in testosterone, all tied to cumulative microtrauma from five daily sessions.
