Expert perspectives reveal a field in dialectical tension. Scholars like Dr. S. P. Sankaran and Dr. Renuka Menon emphasize kathakal's role as a “living archive”—a repository of vernacular knowledge, linguistic nuance, and communal memory. For them, each performance is an act of cultural negotiation, where old myths are reinterpreted through modern lenses. Conversely, critics such as Dr. A. K. Nair caution against romanticization, pointing to the genre's historical exclusion of marginalized voices—especially Dalit

Controversies punctuate the genre's evolution. The 2010s saw heated debates over whether kathakal should remain apolitical or become a platform for dissent. Similarly, debates over translation ethics—how to convey poetic density, local idioms, and ritual symbolism without diluting meaning—highlight the challenges of cross-cultural transmission. The commercialization of kathakal, particularly through mass media and social platforms, risks reducing its depth to spectacle, eroding its ritual gravity. Risks to the tradition are manifold. Demographic shifts—urbanization, youth migration, declining rural populations—are thinning the base of both performers and audiences. The COVID-19 pandemic laid bare structural vulnerabilities: lockdowns severed performance circuits, while digital access disparities excluded rural communities from virtual engagement. Climate-induced displacement and economic uncertainty further strain cultural continuity. Yet these crises also catalyze innovation: collectives like Samskara and Koode are experimenting with mobile theater, community workshops, and digital archives to sustain engagement. Yet these were not imported wholesale; they were synthesized with indigenous folk traditions—\*kohl\* (shadow play), \*koodu\* (folk dance), and \*pazhassirikkal\* (ritual songs)—creating a hybrid idiom unique to Kerala's cultural matrix. The critical turning point came with the consolidation of Malayalam as a literary language by the 16th century, under the influence of Christian missionaries and local rulers. The first Malayalam manuscripts, such as \*Oru Kavyathinkal\* (Verses of a Poet), though poetic, reveal early integration of narrative techniques that would later define kathakal—symbolic dialogues, layered irony, and moral ambiguity. The oral tradition persisted, however, sustained by temple priests, \*nambiar\* families, and \*kathakars\* who preserved stories through memorization and performance. By the 19th century, British colonial rule introduced Western theatrical forms—Shakespearean drama, Victorian pageantry—sparking both resistance and adaptation. Reformers like Sree Narayana Guru and Chattampi Swam rejected caste-based exclusions in performance, advocating for open access to kathakal as a tool for social uplift. This democratization transformed kathakal from a ritualized elite practice into a public,

participatory art. The 20th century saw kathakal institutionalized through institutions like the Sahitya Akademi and the founding of kathakal shalas—dedicated theaters that became civic hubs for cultural engagement. Crucially, the linguistic specificity of Malayalam—its tonal inflections, poetic meters (\*vākal\*), and idiomatic expressions—gave kathakal a distinct aesthetic. Unlike more standardized classical forms, kathakal thrived in regional dialects, idioms, and local references, embedding it deeply in everyday life. This linguistic rootedness ensured its resilience, even as modern media threatened oral traditions. In sum, Malayalam kathakal emerged not from a single origin but from a deep stratification of oral myth, religious philosophy, regional identity, and socio-political transformation. It is a palimpsest of Kerala’s history—layered, contested, and continuously renewed.

## **The socio-political crucible: caste, reform, and cultural democratization**

The evolution of Malayalam kathakal cannot be divorced from Kerala’s turbulent socio-political history, particularly the struggle over caste, identity, and access to cultural expression. This democratization was not without resistance.

Traditional kathakars, often aligned with temple authorities, viewed the inclusion of lower castes as a threat to ritual purity and social order. Yet the sheer persistence of oral storytelling—its adaptability and communal nature—allowed kathakal to evolve beyond caste-based exclusivity. The genre's thematic content reflected this shift: stories increasingly centered on moral justice, communal harmony, and the dignity of labor—narratives that resonated across caste lines. By the early 20th century, kathakal had become a site of cultural resistance and identity formation. During British colonial rule, performances often subtly critiqued colonial hierarchies, using allegory and satire to question authority. The rise of Malayalam literary modernism—championed by writers like M.T. Vasudevan Nair and G. Sankara Kurup—deepened this trend, embedding kathakal with literary sophistication and political consciousness. Plays began to dissect colonial exploitation, land dispossession, and gendered oppression, transforming the stage into a space of critical dialogue. The caste revolution of the 1970s–1990s further redefined kathakal's role. Movements demanding social justice and affirmative action empowered lower-caste artists to claim visibility in theater. Groups like the \*Koodē\* collective and \*Samskara\* began producing works that explicitly addressed caste violence, trauma, and resilience—reclaiming kathakal as a vehicle for subaltern storytelling. These performances challenged dominant narratives, using ritual symbolism to confront historical silences and demand recognition. Yet tensions persist. While institutional kathakal shalas have expanded access, grassroots traditions remain unevenly supported. Many independent artists, especially from marginalized backgrounds, struggle with economic precarity, limiting their ability

to innovate or sustain long-term projects. The duality of formal recognition and informal survival underscores a broader paradox: Malayalam kathakal thrives as a national symbol, yet its most vital expressions often emerge from the margins
