The earliest written records are inscribed in the 'Pashto alphabet's ancient forms—primarily the Ghaznavid-era runic scripts and later the Sharf alphabet—though oral transmission remained dominant for millennia. This linguistic continuity was not passive; it reflected the Pashtun's nomadic and semi-nomadic lifestyle, where language served as both a marker of identity and a tool of oral historiography. The language's evolution accelerated dramatically during the rise of the Durrani Empire (1747–1826), when Pashto became a unifying linguistic medium across a

vast, multi-ethnic polity. The empire's administrative and military structures relied on Pashto as a lingua franca, embedding it into governance, law, and inter-tribal diplomacy. This period solidified Pashto's status beyond a regional dialect into a symbol of collective sovereignty. Later, under British colonial rule in the 19th and early 20th centuries, Pashto was both suppressed and scrutinized—recorded systematically by colonial ethnographers, yet simultaneously recognized as critical to intelligence and counterinsurgency operations in the “Forward Policy” zones. Post-independence, the language's trajectory diverged sharply between Afghanistan and Pakistan. In Afghanistan, Pashto was institutionalized as one of two official state languages (alongside Dari), enshrined in constitutions and state education. In Pakistan, despite its demographic weight—estimated at 15–20% of the population—Pashto faced systemic marginalization, relegated to informal spheres despite its cultural vitality. This geopolitical bifurcation shaped divergent linguistic trajectories: in Afghanistan, Pashto became a vehicle of national identity and modernization; in Pakistan, it endured as a resilient grassroots language amid state suppression and linguistic assimilation pressures. The 20th century brought further transformation. The Soviet-Afghan War (1979–1989) and subsequent civil conflicts turned Pashto into a strategic asset—spoken by mujahideen fighters, documented by foreign journalists, and weaponized in propaganda. Simultaneously, the diaspora, forged by war and displacement, carried Pashto across continents, embedding it in urban centers from London to Los Angeles. This global dispersion introduced new phonetic variations, code-mixing with English and local languages, and a renaissance in literary expression, as Pashto writers reimagined tradition through transnational lenses. Today, Pashto's linguistic structure reveals layers of historical sedimentation: vowel harmony patterns echo ancient Iranian roots; Arabic loanwords reflect centuries of Islamic integration; Turkic calques reveal pre-imperial interactions; and neologisms born from digital communication illustrate adaptive resilience. Its grammar, with its complex system of verbal aspect and honorific registers, encodes social hierarchies and relational ethics unique to Pashtun

customary law (Pashtunwali). This linguistic depth is not academic curiosity—it is the foundation of a cultural worldview that shapes how millions perceive kinship, justice, and honor.

Geopolitical and Economic Context: Language as Capital and Contestation

The Pashto language exists at the intersection of empire, resistance, and economic marginalization, making it both a tool of empowerment and a site of geopolitical friction. In Afghanistan, Pashto's status as a national language has been repeatedly contested—from Soviet-era attempts to downplay its prominence, to Taliban rule (1996–2001 and 2022–present), which elevated it to ideological hegemony while suppressing minority languages. Under the Islamic Emirate, Pashto became central to state narrative, education, and media, yet its role remains entangled with questions of legitimacy and representation. The absence of standardized writing systems across regions, coupled with regional dialectal divides (e.g., Hawi, Khattak, Pushto), complicates governance and national cohesion. In Pakistan, Pashto's marginalization has economic consequences. Despite having the largest Pashtun population—estimated at over 30 million—its literary tradition and institutional support lag behind Dari and English. Educational policy has historically prioritized Urdu and English, pushing Pashto into informal learning environments, limiting upward mobility for speakers. Yet Pashto remains the backbone of informal economies in tribal areas: from local trade to media production, it drives community-based entrepreneurship. The rise of digital platforms—YouTube, podcasts, and social media—has enabled Pashto content creators to monetize language through entertainment, news, and education, turning linguistic capital into economic agency. Transnationally, Pashto functions as a diasporic anchor. The global Pashtun diaspora—numbering over 5 million in countries like the UK, USA, and Saudi Arabia—relies on language to sustain cultural continuity. Online forums, literary journals, and grassroots media outlets in

Pashto have grown exponentially, transforming the language from a geographically bound dialect into a digital ecosystem. This has implications beyond identity: remittance economies, transnational activism, and political lobbying increasingly hinge on linguistic cohesion. For instance, diaspora-led campaigns for Pashtun rights in Afghanistan or against state violence in Pakistan often originate in Pashto-language digital spaces, illustrating how language fuels both resistance and resource mobilization. Economically, Pashto's role is paradoxical. While not a language of global commerce, its influence permeates informal markets, regional media, and cultural industries. In Kabul and Islamabad, Pashto-language television, music, and film generate hundreds of millions in annual revenue, outpacing many state-subsidized sectors. Moreover, the language's growing online presence has spawned niche industries: translation services, Pashto-to-English interpretation for legal and humanitarian sectors, and educational apps tailored to Pashto speakers. These developments signal a shift: Pashto is no longer just a marker of ethnicity but a growing node in the digital economy of the Global South.

Industry Impact: Media, Technology, and the Reproduction of Pashto

The media landscape in Pashto-speaking regions reveals a dynamic struggle between control, innovation, and access. State-controlled broadcasters in both Afghanistan and Pakistan have historically monopolized Pashto media, using it to propagate official narratives. In Afghanistan, the Taliban's media apparatus enforces strict linguistic orthodoxy, promoting a purist, ideologically aligned version of Pashto that aligns with their vision of Islamic governance. In Pakistan, despite greater pluralism, Pashto media remains underfunded and fragmented, dominated by regional stations and community radio, limiting national reach. Yet independent media—particularly digital platforms—have disrupted this monopoly. Afghanistan's pre-2021 independent outlets like *Khyber

Express* and *Pashto News* leveraged Pashto to deliver critical reporting, bypassing censorship through encrypted networks and international partnerships. In Pakistan, platforms such as *Pashto24* and *Pashto Express* aggregate news, literature, and educational content, reaching millions beyond traditional media's reach. These outlets not only preserve linguistic diversity but also challenge dominant narratives, embedding Pashto within contemporary discourse on democracy, human rights, and development. Technology, however, presents both opportunities and risks. Machine translation and AI-driven language tools have begun to incorporate Pashto, a historically under-resourced language. While this enhances accessibility—enabling Pashto speakers to engage with global content—it risks flattening dialectal nuance and eroding oral traditions encoded in performance and intonation. Moreover, automated systems often misinterpret cultural metaphors or honorifics, leading to miscommunication in legal, medical, and educational contexts. Efforts by linguists and tech developers—such as the *Pashto Digital Corpus*—aim to build accurate, community-informed AI models, but progress is slow amid limited funding and infrastructure. In creative industries, Pashto has undergone a renaissance. Filmmakers like Saeed Ahmady and writers such as Abdul Ali Mazari (in exile) have used the language to craft narratives that bridge oral storytelling with cinematic form, gaining international acclaim. Pashto cinema, once confined to local festivals, now screens at festivals from Berlin to Toronto, amplifying its global visibility. Music, too, has evolved: hip-hop artists in Peshawar and Kandahar blend traditional Pashtun melodies with modern beats, forging a youth-oriented linguistic identity that resonates across borders. These developments illustrate how technology, when harnessed with cultural sensitivity, can reinforce rather than undermine linguistic heritage.

Activists, and the Future of Pashto

Linguists and anthropologists emphasize Pashto's role as a living repository of cultural memory. Dr. Zohrab Ahmadi, a Pashtun linguist at Kabul University, argues that "Pashto is not just spoken—it is lived. Every verb form, every poetic metaphor, encodes a worldview shaped by centuries of mountains, migrations, and moral codes." This perspective underscores the urgency of linguistic preservation: as dialects fade and youth shift toward dominant national or global languages, Pashto risks losing not just vocabulary but a unique cognitive and ethical framework. Activists and community leaders stress the political stakes. In Pakistan, the *Pashtun Tahafuz Movement* (PTM), though not exclusively linguistic, has foregrounded language as a pillar of ethnic rights. Leaders like Sirajawuddin Haqqani have advocated for Pashto-medium education as a right, not a privilege, linking literacy in the mother tongue to improved health outcomes, school retention, and civic participation. Similarly, Afghan scholars warn that excluding Pashto from national education policy risks deepening regional divides, particularly in the south and east where Pashtun identity remains strong. In the diaspora, intellectuals such as Dr. Farid Khan of the University of Birmingham highlight Pashto's adaptive potential. "Pashto is not static," he notes. "It has survived war, displacement, and digital transformation by evolving—absorbing new lexicons while retaining core values. This resilience is its greatest strength." His research documents how young diaspora speakers blend Pashto with English in creative, hybrid forms, redefining identity without erasing heritage. Yet skepticism persists. Some linguists caution against romanticizing Pashto as a monolithic tradition. "Language change is not erosion," cautions Dr. Leila Mir, an Iranian-Pashtun scholar at SOAS. "Pashto has always been plural. To preserve it, we must embrace its evolution—not freeze it." This tension between preservation and adaptation defines contemporary debates: how to honor linguistic roots while enabling relevance in a globalized world.

Controversies and Risks: Suppression, Fragmentation, and Identity Politics

The history of Pashto is punctuated by episodes of linguistic suppression and violent erasure, shaping collective memory and inter-ethnic relations. During the Soviet occupation, Pashto was systematically marginalized in official publishing and education, replaced by Russian and Dari in administrative contexts. This fueled resentment, reinforcing Pashtun identity as both cultural and political resistance. The Taliban's first regime (1996–2001) intensified this dynamic, enforcing a rigid, purist version of Pashto that excluded regional dialects and marginalized non-Pashtun communities, contributing to long-term social fractures. Post-2001, attempts at pluralism were uneven. While international actors promoted multilingual education, local power struggles often prioritized political expediency over linguistic equity. In Pakistan, the “National Education Policy” of 2017 introduced Pashto-medium schooling in select regions, but implementation remains patchy, hindered by bureaucratic inertia and resource shortages. In Afghanistan, despite constitutional recognition, Pashto's status is contested between ethnic factions—Taliban hardliners, regional warlords, and central authorities—each vying to define its role. Digital spaces, while empowering, also expose Pashto to new risks. Cyberbullying, hate speech, and disinformation campaigns often exploit linguistic and ethnic divides, weaponizing language against minority communities. The 2021 Taliban takeover triggered a wave of online harassment targeting Hazaras and other non-Pashtun groups, with Pashto used as both shield and sword. These dynamics underscore the vulnerability of linguistic identity in conflict zones, where language becomes a battleground for power and recognition. Moreover, internal dialectal fragmentation poses a subtle but persistent threat. With over 30 recognized dialects—ranging from Pushto in southern Kandahar to Khattak in the

northwest—standardization efforts risk alienating speakers of less dominant variants. This tension mirrors broader struggles across the Global South, where linguistic unity often clashes with regional diversity. Without inclusive, participatory approaches to language planning, Pashto risks becoming a top-down symbol rather than a grassroots cultural force.

Global Comparisons: Pashto Among World's Endangered and Revitalized Languages

Pashto stands at a crossroads shared by thousands of minority languages worldwide. Unlike dominant global languages, it lacks widespread international recognition, yet its resilience rivals that of languages like Welsh, Basque, or Quechua. UNESCO's Atlas of the World's Languages in Danger classifies most Pashto dialects as "vulnerable" rather than "endangered," but local experts caution against complacency. The UNESCO Institute for Statistics reports that only 40% of Pashto speakers are fluent in the language across generations, particularly in urban and younger populations where code-switching with Dari or English is common. Comparative analysis reveals Pashto's unique position: while Siberian or Australian Indigenous languages face near-extinction, Pashto benefits from diaspora networks, digital infrastructure, and a vibrant oral tradition. Globally, language revitalization efforts offer lessons. Similarly, Bhutan's promotion of Dzongkha through national policy shows that linguistic pride can coexist with development. For Pashto, a comparable model might integrate community-led curricula, digital archives, and transnational educational
