Though the Index revised its ethics protocols—now requiring community co-authorship and cultural clearance—the incident exposed deeper tensions about digital sovereignty and the politics of representation. Similarly, debates flare over “hymn laundering”—the repackaging of traditional songs with modern harmonies or secular themes for commercial gain. In the United States, a marketing campaign promoting a “revamped” Laudate hymn as a wellness anthem sparked outrage among traditionalists who saw it as sacrilege. These conflicts underscore a fundamental dilemma: how to honor sacred tradition while enabling creative renewal in a digital age. Legal challenges have also emerged. Several Orthodox jurisdictions have challenged the Index’s use of archival recordings, arguing that audio samples constitute intellectual property requiring ecclesiastical approval. While the Index maintains a fair-use policy for educational purposes, these cases have prompted new legal frameworks for digital liturgical stewardship, with implications beyond Christianity.
