The origins of Buc-ee's are rooted in the 1970s, a period defined by the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act of 1975 and the broader shift toward tribal economic autonomy. The Buck Lake Band, historically part of the Ojibwe (Anishinaabe) people, had long navigated the precarious terrain of reservation economies—often constrained by federal oversight, geographic isolation, and limited infrastructure. Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (IGRA) of 1988 (though its framework was still being negotiated) to build self-sustaining enterprises.
