Meanwhile, Latin American theaters often use shout outs to amplify grassroots movements, as seen in Argentina's Teatro San Martín, where playbills prominently feature feminist collectives and indigenous performers, framing art as resistance. These regional differences reveal a spectrum: from reverence for tradition to radical inclusivity, but all share a common recognition that playbills are more than paper—they are cultural statements.

Future Trajectories: AI, Decentralization, and Trust
