Consider Apple’s “Think Different” campaign, which reframed technological innovation as a lineage of rebels and visionaries, or the mythologized backstories of founders like Steve Jobs or Elon Musk, whose lives are narratively constructed to embody disruption and transcendence. These stories are not mere marketing; they are institutional myths that legitimize market dominance and justify wealth concentration. The “blank” in the narrative becomes the space where investors, consumers, and employees project meaning—where data and promise converge.

Yet Fitzgerald's *Gatsby* also warns of the perils embedded in such narrative construction. The novel's tragic core lies in Gatsby's inability to bridge the gap between his reinvented self and the social reality that demands lineage, reputation, and embeddedness. His blank past—filled only in the imagination—proves unbridgeable, exposing the hollowness of performative authenticity. As political economist Ha-Joon Chang observes, development myths must be grounded in historical truth; otherwise, they risk becoming self-defeating.
