The infrastructure enabling this was surprisingly sophisticated. Students leveraged open-source tools, decentralized networks, and even compromised school Wi-Fi routers to route traffic through proxy servers. In some cases, entire networks were optimized for low-latency music streaming, with students sharing bandwidth and rotating access to minimize detection. Cybersecurity reports from 2018 reveal that over 30% of school-grid intrusions involved music-related domains—some benign, others malicious. Malware disguised as music files infected devices, harvesting personal data or disrupting network operations.
