In Belarus, where state control over public religion is strict, possession of pagan texts became a quiet act of defiance, with small study circles meeting in private homes under the radar. The book's geopolitical significance deepened as climate change intensified. As

droughts, floods, and wildfires destabilized rural economies, communities turned to its rituals for psychological and ecological grounding. Independent publishers, often operating outside mainstream distribution, embraced the book's ethos—producing limited editions with artisanal craftsmanship, hand-bound paper, and multilingual translations that preserved linguistic nuance. In Canada, a First Nations collective partnered with the book's editors to create a bilingual edition, integrating Indigenous land-based prayers into the Slavic framework—a bold act of inter-spiritual dialogue. Yet monetization introduced tensions. While purists lamented the

dilution of sacred texts into marketable products, proponents argued that controlled commercialization enabled broader access and preservation.
