Meanwhile, in the West, the Cold War’s fascination with Eastern spirituality catalyzed a boom in Rumi translations—many in poetic form—by figures like Coleman Barks, whose work, though controversial among traditional scholars, democratized access to Rumi’s voice across linguistic and cultural borders. The spiritual depth of Rumi’s verses—steeped in Sufi metaphysics of **fana** (annihilation) and **baqa** (subsistence)—is often flattened into feel-good aphorisms in digital spaces, divorced from their theological and historical context. Scholars such as Amina Wadud and Tariq Ramadan warn of a “Rumi industrial complex” that prioritizes marketability over authenticity, diluting the ethical rigor embedded in the original texts. Furthermore, the appropriation of Rumi’s name by non-Muslim entrepreneurs and self-proclaimed “spiritual influencers” raises questions about cultural ownership, authenticity, and the sacralization of a figure whose essence defies such reduction. From a geopolitical lens, **bacaan al-Quran tulisan Rumi** functions as a soft power tool across multiple spheres. In Turkey, state-backed cultural diplomacy leverages Rumi’s universalism to project a moderate, Sufi-inflected Islam on the global stage. Meanwhile, the rise of “spiritual tourism” centered on Rumi’s shrines—Konya, Mount Pul-i-Bastak, and the Galata Mevlevi—has spurred local economies, blending religious pilgrimage with cultural heritage. Expert perspectives diverge sharply on the trajectory of **bacaan al-Quran tulisan Rumi**. Dr. Sezgin Fatma, a historian of Islamic manuscript culture, argues that the written **bacaan** tradition remains vital for preserving the textual integrity of Rumi’s spiritual message, especially in an era of rapid digital flux. Controversies surround the very notion of “tulisan” as a legitimate form of engagement. Traditional **muhaddithun** (hadith scholars) often dismiss non-scholarly **bacaan** as speculative, while postmodern critics praise its fluidity as a form of living interpretation. The tension between **naql** (transmitted knowledge) and **ijtihad** (independent reasoning) is embodied in this debate: is **bacaan tulisan Rumi** an extension of authentic tradition, or a departure into cultural innovation? Risks include the erosion of textual authority, the fragmentation of meaning across competing interpretations, and the potential for exploitation—both commercial and ideological. This early transmission was deeply contextual. In Konya's madrasas and dervish lodges, recitation was not merely performative but pedagogical, embedded in daily **dhikr** (remembrance) rituals.
