The involvement of private military and intelligence firms further complicates the landscape. Companies like Wagner Group in Africa or Booz Allen Hamilton in cybersecurity

operate in legal gray zones, contracted by governments to conduct deniable operations. Feehan argues that this privatization of power erodes democratic checks: when security functions are outsourced, oversight diminishes, and accountability evaporates into layers of corporate opacity.

Expert Perspectives: The Epistemic Crisis
