Critics highlight disparities in access: candidates in rural or low-resource areas often lack proximity to test centers, with limited preparation materials and proctoring support. This risks entrenching inequity, where certification becomes a privilege rather than a right. Moreover, the exam's content has faced scrutiny. Some argue that its emphasis on Western clinical protocols may not reflect global best practices. In Japan, for instance, the cultural emphasis on consensus-based care and holistic patient management challenges the individualistic, decision-heavy scenarios typical of U.S.-aligned exams. Similarly, in Indigenous communities, nursing education must balance standardized competencies with culturally grounded care—raising questions about whether a one-size-fits-all exam adequately assesses contextual intelligence. Another risk lies in over-reliance on standardized testing. While simulations and case studies improve realism, they cannot fully replicate the emotional intensity of real-world surgery. A candidate may score flawlessly on a virtual hemorrhage scenario but falter in the chaos of an actual OR, where fatigue, distractions, and team dynamics shift unpredictably. This has prompted calls for hybrid assessment models—combining exams with real-time performance evaluations and peer observation. Finally, the exam's role in professional identity is contested. Some nurses view certification as validation of their expertise and autonomy, while others see it as an imposition—an external metric that may not capture the nuance of frontline judgment. Dr. Amara Nkosi notes: 'In places like Nigeria, where nursing is deeply relational, the exam's technical focus can feel disconnected from the lived reality of care. We need frameworks that honor both skill and empathy.'
