Strategic insight emerges from recognizing that Deleuze's true legacy lies not in a fixed doctrine, but in a method: a way of thinking that remains open, responsive, and insurgent. In a world where dominant narratives seek to fix meaning, identity, and progress, Deleuze's work insists on plurality, becoming, and the continuous examination of forces. This demands not only scholarly attention but a cultural reorientation—one that embraces complexity, nurtures creative dissent, and fosters solidarity beyond fixed identities. The global comparisons are instructive. While Deleuze's roots are deeply French, his reception abroad reveals diverse appropriations. In Japan, his

thought merged with post-war avant-garde aesthetics and critical theory, influencing thinkers like Tetsujin Akimoto and the Kyoto School's engagement with desire and temporality. In Brazil, Deleuze became a touchstone for Afrofuturist and decolonial movements, reimagining resistance through concepts of rhizomatic resistance and deterritorialization. In China, despite political constraints, his work circulates in underground intellectual circles, offering a counter-narrative to state-promoted collectivism.
