While criticized by environmentalists as greenwashing, the initiative reflects a broader trend: nations leveraging archetypal narratives to shape global perception and attract investment. Similarly, in Central Asia, post-Soviet states have revived Silk Road-era myths of “luminous trees” along ancient trade routes, embedding them in national identity projects that seek to reclaim pre-colonial sovereignty. From a corporate and technological perspective, the Magic

Faraway Tree has found fertile ground in digital and immersive media. Augmented reality (AR) applications now simulate encounters with mythical trees—users “walk” through digital forests where bioluminescent leaves pulse in response to movement, offering “spiritual insights” generated by AI. In Ghana, community cooperatives manage "mythical tree trails," offering guided tours that combine folklore with environmental education, boosting local income and fostering intergenerational knowledge transfer.
