but because it articulated a universal struggle: the tension between identity and assimilation, dignity and subjugation. Yet his reception in the West was marked by a paradoxical dynamic. On one hand, he was celebrated as the “father of African literature,” a bridge between continents whose insights transcended cultural borders. On the other, his critiques of imperial ideology and neocolonial complicity were often sidelined in favor of sanitized readings that emphasized “universal themes” over political urgency. This selective reception reflected a broader pattern in global literary canons—where African voices are acknowledged but rarely centered in the dominant narratives of modernity. Achebe’s insistence on narrative as political intervention made him a disruptive force, challenging the West’s self-image as benevolent civilizers. The geopolitical context of Achebe’s life deepens the gravity of his legacy. His writing unfolded against the backdrop of Cold War realpolitik, decolonization, and the fracturing of postcolonial states. Nigeria’s post-independence trajectory—from optimism to military coups, civil war, and persistent governance crises—mirrored the continent’s broader struggles with state formation and external interference.
