This has led to what scholars call “attention capitalism,” where algorithms prioritize content that captures and retains focus, regardless of veracity. The result is a race to the bottom: sensationalism rewards attention, while nuance is buried. This dynamic is global but uneven: in the Global South, mobile-first platforms amplify

misinformation in local languages, often exploiting linguistic and cultural divides. Regulation remains fragmented. The EU's Digital Services Act (DSA) and Digital Markets Act (DMA) represent a bold attempt to impose transparency, accountability, and user rights. In contrast, the U.S. remains divided, with Section 230 under constant legal and political scrutiny.

Authoritarian states bypass regulation entirely, enforcing narrative uniformity through state-backed platforms and surveillance. The absence of global standards enables a race to the bottom, where bad actors exploit jurisdictional gaps. This asymmetry creates a world where information flows are governed more by power than principle. The perplexed observer sees not chaos alone, but a structured contest—between openness and control, innovation and exploitation, truth and manipulation.

Professional Journalism in the Age of Disinformation

The role of journalism has undergone a profound transformation. Once anchored in gatekeeping and verification, it now operates in a networked, fragmented ecosystem where speed often trumps depth. The 24/7 news cycle, fueled by digital

platforms, demands constant output—yet the tools for verification lag. Fact-checking, once a manual process, now competes with AI-generated content, deepfakes, and synthetic media that blur the line between fact and fiction. In Latin America, trust in institutions is low, and disinformation exploits this vacuum—particularly during elections. Brazil’s 2018 and 2022 elections saw unprecedented use of AI-generated content and coordinated bot campaigns,
