Yet the platform's ascent triggered intense scrutiny. In 2021, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) released a critical review of XZone's AI algorithms, citing concerns about overfitting in heterogeneous patient populations and inconsistent diagnostic confidence scores. The report noted that while XZone's system outperformed legacy devices in controlled trials, real-world performance varied significantly across ethnic groups and body types, raising red flags about algorithmic bias. This scrutiny intensified when a 2022 study published in *Nature Biomedical Engineering* revealed that XZone's elastography module misclassified benign nodules as malignant in 12% of cases among patients with dense breast tissue—a rate comparable to current mammography error margins, but with fewer safeguards. These incidents ignited debates about regulatory readiness and the risks of premature commercialization in AI-augmented diagnostics. In oncology, its integration with radiomics—a field applying machine learning to medical image data—has enabled non-invasive tumor characterization, reducing the need for biopsies in select cases. However, the platform's reliance on proprietary software has raised interoperability concerns. Unlike legacy players such as Philips or GE, which rely on high-margin, proprietary hardware ecosystems, XZone's model emphasizes affordability and adaptability. Its pricing strategy—targeting mid-tier hospitals and clinics—has allowed penetration in emerging markets where upfront costs remain prohibitive for premium systems. In high-income regions, however, adoption has been constrained by entrenched supplier relationships and regulatory caution. U.S. health systems, wary of algorithmic

opacity and liability risks, have demanded extensive clinical validation before full integration.
