A 2022 OECD study on regional governance noted Maryland’s “patchwork resilience”: local innovation thrives, but statewide coordination lags, especially in climate adaptation and affordable housing. The international precedent suggests that digital integration and inter-municipal compacts enhance effectiveness. In the Netherlands, overlapping jurisdictions are managed through formal intergovernmental agreements and shared digital platforms, ensuring transparency and accountability.
