Internal DOLE audits revealed chronic underfunding: Idaho’s law enforcement budget, adjusted for inflation, had declined by 19% between 2015 and 2023, while felony case backlogs grew by 44%. Staffing shortages were acute—IDLE reported 32% of sheriff’s offices operating below minimum staffing standards—and interagency coordination remained fragmented, with federal, state, and tribal jurisdictions often operating in silos. criminal justice system, designed for a bygone era of localized, property-based offenses, lacked the tools—technological, financial, or institutional—to counter 21st-century organized crime.

Meanwhile, local governments struggled to attract investment as perceptions of instability deterred small businesses and tourism—key economic pillars in counties like Blaine and Kootenai. The tech and finance sectors felt indirect but significant effects. Idaho's burgeoning fintech sector, once celebrated for its regulatory agility, faced heightened scrutiny over compliance with federal anti-money laundering (AML) rules. The Idaho Federal Reserve issued a rare warning in 2024 about "elevated risks in decentralized finance platforms," prompting several startups to relocate headquarters to states with stronger oversight. Moreover, the exposure of Idaho's digital vulnerabilities reverberated globally: multinational corporations with supply chain nodes in the state revised risk assessments, with some shifting data centers to Wyoming and Montana.
