In Venezuela, amid hyperinflation and supply shortages, bishops leverage the form to source locally available staples—cornmeal, beans, salt—prioritizing affordability and regional resilience over imported goods. LDS-affiliated food banks and grocery outlets—such as those in Utah, Idaho, and parts of Brazil—function as hybrid entities: faith-based service with commercial efficiency. In Iowa, a major LDS population center, local co-ops supply thousands of bushels of organic wheat and soy annually, driven in part by Church procurement contracts.
