North Korea's conservatories enforce strict adherence to Western classical training, including solfège, as a means of cultural alignment with global norms while maintaining ideological control. In contrast, democratic societies increasingly integrate multicultural curricula—yet even here, do re mi remains the default standard, subtly privileging Western cognitive frameworks. UNESCO's 2022 Cultural Diversity in Music Education initiative calls for "inclusive notation systems," but implementation remains uneven, revealing structural biases in global music policy. Risks accompany this dominance. The overreliance on do re mi in AI composition risks producing homogenized output that fails to capture regional tonal nuances. A 2024 MIT Media Lab study found that AI models trained exclusively on Western sheet music produce harmonic progressions that feel "emotionally flat" to listeners from non-Western

backgrounds, lacking the microtonal inflections and rhythmic elasticity central to their traditions. Furthermore, the commercial imperative to standardize sheet music and digital tools marginalizes non-diatonic systems, threatening their survival. Without intentional intervention, do re mi could become a global monoculture, eroding the rich tapestry of human sonic expression. Yet forward-looking projections suggest a transformational shift. The rise of adaptive AI and neuro-auditory interfaces enables personalized music learning—where do re mi is not a fixed starting point but a dynamic node in a fluid, user-responsive system. Companies like Aiva and Amper Music now develop AI that learns from global repertoires, generating compositions that blend Western tonality with regional microtonal systems. In Finland, public schools pilot “sonic ecologies” curricula, where students explore multiple tuning systems through interactive digital platforms, fostering both musical literacy and cultural empathy. Expert Dr. Lila Moreau, a cognitive scientist at the École Normale Supérieure, posits: “The future lies not in choosing between do re mi and alternatives, but in creating a polyphonic literacy—where learners navigate multiple tonal worlds as naturally as bilinguals switch languages. This requires reimagining notation not as a single script but as a living, evolving dialogue.” Such models resonate with emerging fields like sonic anthropology and critical musicology, which treat music as a site of power, identity, and resistance. Long-term implications hinge on institutional change.
