She cites his 1945 entry on **Moringa oleifera**, where he notes: "Local healers use the root decoction for diabetes; no toxicology reported—suggests untapped potential." This aligns with recent findings: Moringa's glucosinolates show promise in glycemic regulation. Conversely, Dr. Elias Varga, a Hungarian pharmacologist at ETH Zurich, cautions: "Clarke's field notes lack the rigor of modern toxicology. Many entries assume universal safety; clinical data is sparse. We cannot bypass Phase I trials." His critique reflects a broader tension: how to honor traditional knowledge without romanticizing it, or ignoring its risks. Yet a third strand of thought—championed by the WHO's Traditional Medicine Strategy—positions Clarke's archive as a model for "integrated medicine systems." By combining ethnobotanical data with AI-driven pharmacokinetic modeling, researchers are now identifying novel compound synergies—such as the **Croton megalocarpus**-turmeric combination Clarke used for dysentery—now in Phase II trials. Clinicopathologists like Dr. Fatima Al-Masri emphasize that Clarke's greatest contribution may be epistemological: his insistence that healing is not just chemistry, but context. "Drugs don't act in isolation," she states. "Clarke's notes on ritual context—preparation timing, community rituals—are not anecdotal. They shape bioavailability and efficacy."
