Yet this industry is fragile: chytrid fungus, a fungal pathogen spread via global trade, has decimated populations in Central America, undermining local economies dependent on biodiversity tourism. The biotech sector also eyes amphibians. The skin secretions of certain frogs—like the African clawed frog (*Xenopus laevis*)—contain antimicrobial peptides with pharmaceutical potential, used in wound healing and antibiotic development. Toads, too, have contributed to scientific breakthroughs: the insulin-like peptides in *Bufo* species inspired early diabetes research. These applications underscore a hidden
