Care Development Agency, described the RN model as “a necessity born of scarcity.” She emphasized its role in “extending the reach of skilled care without requiring every rural community to host a full obstetric unit.” Conversely, pediatric neonatologist Dr. Jean-Pierre Ouedraogo cautioned against overreliance, warning in a 2019 *Lancet* commentary that “algorithmic triage risks depersonalizing care—especially in contexts where clinical judgment must remain rooted in empathy, not data points.” The controversies were immediate and multifaceted. Privacy concerns emerged as maternal health data—including sensitive indicators like gestational age, fetal heart patterns, and maternal psychological profiles—were transmitted across networks. In India’s 2019 pilot in Rajasthan, a data breach exposed records of over 12,000 women, triggering parliamentary scrutiny. Regulators responded by mandating end-to-end encryption and regional data storage, setting precedents for compliance frameworks now adopted in Ghana and Uganda. Legal liability posed another thorn. When an RN’s remote recommendation failed to prevent a neonatal complication, questions arose: Was the nurse legally accountable? Was the platform provider liable? In response, South Africa’s Department of Health issued 2020 guidelines defining “remote supervised care” as a tiered responsibility model, requiring institutional oversight, real-time audit trails, and mandatory peer review.
