While many industrial houses clung to colonial assets, he divested from Southern cotton holdings post-1914, instead investing in Appalachian coal, Midwestern steel, and emerging electrical grids across the U.S. This transition reflected a broader recalibration: the family's survival depended not on clinging to old monopolies, but on embedding themselves in the infrastructure of a new world order—one defined by U.S. industrial primacy and the fragmentation of European empires.

The family's entanglement with power extended beyond economics into governance and policy. James Robert served as an informal advisor to British colonial administrations in the 1920s, particularly in Southern Africa, where his firm held concessions for copper and diamond transportation. Declassified Foreign Office files reveal that Donaldson interests were instrumental in stabilizing regions critical to Allied war efforts and later in shaping post-war development policies. Their historical strength in logistics and cross-border coordination positions them well to lead in global value chains of the 2030s. Yet their greatest challenge may be cultural: sustaining a dynastic ethos of stewardship amid rapid change, and balancing private ambition with public responsibility.
