In the realm of policy, Cusick’s emphasis on provenance and cultural ownership strengthens arguments for international cooperation in heritage protection. His sketches are increasingly used in UNESCO forums and legal cases involving looted artifacts, serving as compelling visual evidence in restitution claims. Looking further, the fusion of journalism, art, and digital storytelling pioneered by Cusick may redefine historical authority itself. As AI-generated reconstructions proliferate, the human interpretive layer—grounded in research, ethics, and narrative craft—becomes more vital. Cusick’s work exemplifies how authenticity lies not in perfect data, but in transparent, accountable storytelling. Strategic insight suggests that future historical narratives will be co-created: scholars, artists, technologists, and descendant communities collaborating in open, multidisciplinary ecosystems.
