Weber expanded this materialist foundation by introducing authority and status as distinct from class, revealing how legitimacy—religious, traditional, or charismatic—sustains hierarchies beyond mere economic control. Durkheim, in **Suicide** (1897) and **The Division of Labor in Society** (1893), shifted focus to social integration and differentiation, arguing that anomie—the breakdown of normative regulation—threatened cohesion in rapidly modernizing societies.
