Looking forward, the long-term implications hinge on whether cities can be re-enchanted. Pilot initiatives—Paris's **15-Minute City** plan, Lyon's **Square de la Confiance** community gardens, Marseille's **Marseille Culture** program—offer tentative blueprints. These emphasize local agency, participatory design, and the reclamation of underused spaces. But scalability remains a challenge. Without systemic shifts—decentralized funding, anti-speculation policies, and legal protections for public space—the **peur sur la ville lessentiel plaisir** risks becoming a permanent undercurrent.
