These exercises, printed on cheap paper and distributed widely, were not merely educational but instruments of national cohesion, instilling shared linguistic norms in a rapidly urbanizing society. In the U.S., as Horace Mann championed common schools, B worksheets became tools to “civilize” diverse immigrant populations, often privileging English phonics over heritage languages. This period marked a critical shift: literacy moved from elite privilege to state-managed necessity.
