The Russia-Ukraine war, beginning in 2014 and escalating in 2022, introduced a new dimension: the expectation of persistent hybrid warfare, including disinformation, cyber sabotage, and energy weaponization. Western governments and NATO-aligned corporations now routinely simulate “hybrid attack” scenarios, where a physical strike on infrastructure is coupled with information operations and financial disruption. These exercises test not only technical resilience but also decision-making under uncertainty, interagency cooperation, and stakeholder communication. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security’s annual “Cyber Shield” drills, involving over 100 critical infrastructure entities, exemplify this trend—blending technical simulations with crisis messaging and public relations strategy.
