IGSC programs—often branded as Oxford International, Cambridge International, or Cambridge IGCSE English as a Second Language—provided a standardized, internationally recognized benchmark. Governments, particularly in emerging economies like Vietnam, Indonesia, and Brazil, adopted IGSC frameworks to align national education systems with global labor market expectations. The language thus evolved into a form of human capital investment, where proficiency in English was no longer optional but essential for upward

In South Africa, for instance, where eleven official languages exist, IGSC programs are frequently delivered in English, reinforcing its dominance despite constitutional commitments to multilingualism. “English in education is not neutral,” Nkosi writes. “It carries historical weight and contemporary privilege, and without intentional design, IGSC risks replicating colonial hierarchies under the guise of global competence.” Conversely, education economist Prof. Rajiv Mehta argues that IGSC is “a pragmatic necessity in a world where English remains the dominant language of knowledge production.” He points to countries like Rwanda and Ghana, where IGSC has significantly improved labor market outcomes, particularly for youth seeking employment in sectors such as tourism, IT services, and international trade. “The alternative—linguistic isolation—would condemn entire generations to marginalization,” Mehta asserts. “IGSC is not about linguistic imperialism, but about equipping people with tools to navigate and shape global systems.”

Controversies and Risks: Equity, Access, and Pedagogical Legitimacy

Despite its widespread adoption, IGSC faces persistent criticism. One major concern is access inequality. While digital platforms have expanded reach, they often assume baseline infrastructure—stable internet, devices, trained teachers—that remains unavailable in rural and low-income regions. In sub-Saharan Africa, for example, only 22% of the population has reliable internet access, limiting the effectiveness of IGSC digital modules. This digital divide exacerbates existing educational disparities, turning language proficiency into another axis of inequality. Another risk lies in pedagogical standardization. IGSC curricula, while rigorous, often prioritize mechanical accuracy and test performance over critical literacy, creativity, and cultural responsiveness. contexts, multilingual practices, and digital literacies to make English learning more inclusive and relevant. Immigration and citizenship testing regimes, too, have drawn scrutiny. In countries like the UK and Australia, IGCSE-level English proficiency is often a de facto gatekeeper for residency and citizenship, raising questions about whether fluency under high-stakes testing reflects true communicative ability or performance under pressure. Advocates warn that such systems can penalize non-native speakers for accent, syntax, or cultural differences rather than genuine language competence.
