By the medieval era, tithes had become institutionalized across Christendom, funded cathedrals, monastic orders, and feudal economies, often controlled by ecclesiastical authorities whose influence extended into politics and land tenure. The Reformation challenged this model, with Protestant reformers like Luther and Calvin rejecting mandatory tithes as unbiblical, advocating instead for a covenant-based, voluntary giving—yet paradoxically, the expectation of giving persisted, redefined as an expression of grace rather than a transaction with divine favor.
