Audiences, split along racial lines, experienced conflicting interpretations: some saw Harold's vulnerability as a mirror to their own complicity; others recognized in the boys' silence a powerful indictment of systemic silence. Internationally, the play's 1990 London debut at the National Theatre, starring John Kani and Trevor Nzama, catalyzed global attention. Critics praised its psychological depth and moral clarity, but few grasped the full weight of its cultural subtext. Literary critic Professor Amara Nkosi of Rhodes University interprets the label as a form of narrative resistance: "Fugard, working with black actors and writers, reclaims voice.
