Secure, jam-resistant communications—using low-probability-of-intercept satellite links and quantum key distribution prototypes—are now essential. China’s People’s Liberation Army Navy (PLAN) has invested heavily in indigenous communication technologies to reduce reliance on Western systems, mirroring Russia’s development of resilient, decentralized command networks. The U.S. response, through initiatives like the Marine Corps’ Integrated Tactical Network (ITN), emphasizes interoperability with allies and resilient mesh networking to survive contested electromagnetic environments.
