The IMF and World Bank, in their structural adjustment programs across Africa and Latin America, promoted standardized education reforms as prerequisites for market integration. Decimal literacy was framed as a “competency” necessary for participation in global supply chains. In Nigeria, where over 70% of the population worked in informal agriculture or trade, the adoption of decimal multiplication worksheets aligned with IMF-mandated education efficiency targets. Yet this standardization also served a deeper political function: creating a uniform, national numeracy framework that transcended regional linguistic and cultural differences. By teaching children to multiply 0.4 by 7, the worksheet implicitly reinforced a centralized, secular vision of citizenship—one that transcended local economies and embraced national integration. Brazil's use of decimal worksheets under military rule illustrates another dimension: the weaponization of mathematical precision. In a country marked by extreme inequality, the state deployed standardized arithmetic as a tool of discipline and control. By mandating that every child master decimal multiplication, the regime sought to produce a workforce disciplined in financial logic—capable of navigating formal banking systems, understanding interest rates, and adhering to budgetary constraints. A street vendor calculating daily profit, for instance, might operate on a decimal logic unfamiliar to rigid school exercises—highlighting a disconnect between state-imposed numeracy and lived economic practice. Globally, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and World Bank have since elevated numeracy to a proxy for institutional competence. In structural adjustment programs across Africa and Latin America, decimal multiplication became a benchmark for “educational readiness”—a proxy for a nation's ability to absorb market reforms. Countries that implemented standardized arithmetic curricula were deemed more “prepared” for integration into global finance, even when such metrics ignored deeper social and economic inequities.
