The absence of full sovereignty restricts Puerto Rico's capacity to leverage territorial size into geopolitical leverage, despite its strategic location near major shipping routes. The disparity in international standing is stark: Cuba maintains diplomatic relations with over 150 nations, participates in UN bodies, and hosts regional summits; Puerto Rico, by virtue of its territory status, cannot join such forums. Its size, while smaller, is politically subsumed under U.S. authority, rendering territorial scale a double-edged sword—largely symbolic in global governance.
