In contrast, in liberal democracies, journaling often serves as a counterbalance to institutional opacity; investigative journalists such as Glenn Greenwald and Seymour Hersh rely on private journals to cross-check sources, preserve memory, and protect sensitive information before publication. Economically, the journal's form has been shaped by technological and commercial forces. The rise of printing in the 15th century enabled mass distribution of journals—from 18th-century periodicals like *The Spectator* to 19th-century literary magazines. The 20th century saw the proliferation of specialized journals—economic, scientific, political—each tied to institutional funding, academic prestige, or corporate sponsorship. In the digital era, subscription models, paywalls, and platform algorithms have redefined access and distribution. Yet the core challenge endures: how to sustain editorial independence in an environment where attention is monetized and data is commodified. The journal's economic sustainability also affects its depth. Traditional print journals, funded by subscriptions or endowments, can afford the time and resources for long-form inquiry. Digital-native outlets often face pressure to produce rapid content, risking the erosion of the slow, reflective practice that defines meaningful journaling. Yet new models—nonprofit-backed, reader-supported, and cooperative—are emerging. These suggest that the journal's survival depends not only on financial innovation but on reclaiming its role as a sanctuary for depth in an age of distraction.
