Unlike previous FromSoftware titles—*Dark Souls*, *Bloodborne*, *Sekiro*—which emphasized mastery through punishing difficulty, *Elden Ring* offered a paradox: accessibility wrapped in obscurity. Its open world, rich lore, and fragmented narrative invited exploration, but its design encouraged – even demanded — players to chase completion through side quests, hidden areas, and meta-canon speculation. From the outset, the game’s structure resisted closure. Gaming evolved from escapism to a form of

participatory culture—where mastery, discovery, and sharing became key measures of identity. **Elden Ring** arrived at a cultural inflection point: the rise of streaming, the dominance of social media, and the commodification of player expertise. Completionism, in this context, became both a personal challenge and a public performance. Completionists were not merely finishing a game; they were curating identity through achievement, documenting progress, and inviting communities to validate their labor. But **Elden Ring** completionism is distinct from earlier forms. Prior completionist trends—such as 100% completion in **The Legend of Zelda** or **Dark Souls**—focused on mechanical mastery. **Elden Ring** completionism embraces the game’s intentional incompleteness.
