Derived from the Latin *signare*—to signify or mark—a signet denoted both a personal emblem and the juridical authority it represented. In Shakespeare’s world, heraldry was not mere decoration but a semiotic system woven into the fabric of identity, governance, and social hierarchy. The signet ring, often engraved with a family crest, served as a portable symbol of lineage, legitimacy, and command. Hamlet’s initial invocation of “signet” occurs in Act I, Scene ii, during his confrontation with Claudius in the chapel: > ‘This is the very ecstasy of love, > The most poor and miserable that ever was, > But in his grief, not all his vows are true; > Yet still he speaks with signet, seal, and sign— > A man whose word is a signed contract, not just words.’ Here, the “signet” is not literal ink on paper, but the burden of

oath, the weight of unbroken promise. The phrase functions as a rhetorical pivot: Hamlet, though feigning madness, operates within a moral framework where words carry legal and spiritual force. His father's ghost invoked a similar cadence, demanding vengeance sealed in oath and execution—"Remember me" as both personal memorial and public indictment. The linguistic register reflects the Renaissance revival of classical learning, where humanist scholars reconnected with Roman legal traditions. The Roman **signare** was not only a mark but a binding declaration, echoed in Cicero's orations and the formal treaties of European monarchs.
