Countries like France, with advanced reprocessing, manage long-term waste through technological closure, while others, such as the U.S., grapple with political and technical limbo, where even 10,000-year half-lives challenge governance. The worksheet's questions implicitly confront the ethical paradox: isotopes decay, but their consequences often outlive the choices that birthed them. Chernobyl's 1986 disaster unleashed Cs-137 and I-131, which persist in the Exclusion Zone, a frozen landscape where half-lives measure time more precisely than human memory. The 2011 Fukushima meltdown released isotopes with half-lives spanning decades, contaminating oceans and fisheries, their decay timelines now part of regional economic and health narratives. Expert testimony sharpens this analysis. Dr. Kate Brown, historian and author of 'Manual for Survival,' notes: 'Radioactive isotopes compress centuries into years. Their half-lives are not just physical
