He cites studies showing that students using elaborative mnemonics outperform peers in both recall and critical thinking, particularly when tasks require connecting theory to real-world behavior. In contrast, Dr. Linda Chen, a clinical psychologist specializing in cognitive development, cautions against over-reliance: “Mnemonics are tools, not substitutes.” She notes that overuse can lead to brittle knowledge—memory stored as rigid scripts rather than flexible schemas.
