Their conversation begins not with greetings, but with silence—ten minutes that carry the weight of shared history. Layla, a freelance journalist based in Beirut, speaks first, her voice measured: "I've never felt the weight of Eid like this. Not since the wars in Syria began, not since my cousin's village was reduced to rubble. But here, on this terrace, it's warmth. It's family.
