And he exposed the systemic exclusion of women and non-European composers: figures like the Japanese pianist and composer Yosuke Yamashita, whose *Piano Concerto No. 2* (1957) integrated **gagaku** motifs with post-war modernism, were rarely performed in Western mainstream circuits, despite critical acclaim in Tokyo and Berlin. Economically, Snell's analysis revealed how Cold War politics influenced repertoire dissemination. The U.S. State Department's cultural diplomacy, through programs like Jazz Ambassadors, promoted certain composers while sidelining others—particularly those associated with socialist regimes. As a professor at the University of Cambridge and advisor to major conservatories, he reshaped curricula to emphasize critical engagement with repertoire.
