The 1947 accession crisis was not merely a territorial dispute but a constitutional rupture. Singh's Instrument of Accession, signed with India under duress amid invasion by tribal militias from Pakistan, was accepted by Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru, who framed it as a temporary measure pending plebiscite.

Pakistan rejected the legitimacy of the accession, citing flawed conditions and lack of international oversight. Thus, the dispute became institutionalized: India administered Jammu, Kashmir, and Ladakh; Pakistan controlled Azad Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan; and China, via a 1963 treaty, secured Aksai Chin. The 1948 UN resolutions called for a plebiscite, but both states refused to withdraw forces, entrenching a de facto division along the Line of Control (LoC)—a militarized buffer zone patrolled by over 500,000 Indian troops and hundreds of Pakistani soldiers, with civilian casualties mounting in its shadow. The geopolitical weight of Kashmir transcends South Asia. For India, it is a core national security concern, vital to its territorial integrity and strategic posture vis-à-vis Pakistan and China. Geopolitical realism, however, warns against premature optimism. Pakistan's military establishment views Kashmir as a strategic asset; India's public discourse resists ceding territory; China's interests are increasingly aligned with Islamabad; and regional instability risks drawing in global powers. The 2020 Ladakh standoff between India and China underscored how Kashmir's periphery remains volatile. Risks of escalation are acute. A full-scale war between India and Pakistan over Kashmir could trigger nuclear deterrence, with catastrophic humanitarian and environmental consequences. Climate

change exacerbates these dangers: glacial retreat threatens water security for 1.3 billion downstream, intensifying resource competition.
