For tech firms, this means predictable compliance frameworks rather than conflicting national laws—a boon in an era where data sovereignty is a strategic asset. In finance, the Forum’s cross-border payment system, the Federated Ledger Network (FLN), now handles over \$2.3 trillion in annual transactions, bypassing traditional SWIFT dependencies. For banks and fintechs, FLN offers interoperability without relinquishing control over customer data—a rare balance in an increasingly regulated world.
