The rise of research and development departments in the 20th century—epitomized by Bell Labs and Xerox PARC—marked a new era where creativity became institutionalized. These labs were not just technical hubs but sociotechnical systems designed to optimize innovation through structured

experimentation, interdisciplinary collaboration, and risk tolerance. Yet Lehrer is acutely aware of the contradictions: while such environments can produce breakthroughs—like the transistor or graphical user interface—they are also susceptible to bureaucratic inertia, short-term profit pressures, and the suppression of “wild” thinking in favor of measurable outcomes. The geopolitical dimension further complicates this picture. Lehrer traces how Cold War competition catalyzed American investment in cognitive science, neuroimaging, and education, framing creativity as a strategic asset in ideological warfare. The Soviet Union’s emphasis on collective engineering contrasted with the U.S. model of individual genius, yet both recognized that cognitive capacity was a national resource. In the post-Cold War era, globalization intensified this dynamic.
