This move not only strengthened internal market cohesion but also signaled EU leadership in shaping global trust standards. In the United States, adoption was more fragmented but no less strategic. While federal oversight lagged, state and private actors led innovation. California implemented medallion-based licensing for healthcare professionals, citing improved patient safety. Meanwhile, defense contractors like Lockheed Martin developed proprietary medallion variants for secure supply chains, integrating them with AI-driven threat detection platforms. The U.S. approach emphasized flexibility and market-driven evolution, allowing rapid iteration but raising concerns about interoperability and equity. Emerging economies, particularly in Africa and Southeast Asia, viewed the medallion as a tool for governance modernization. In Kenya, the government deployed medallions to streamline civil service appointments and anti-corruption monitoring, reducing bureaucratic bottlenecks and patronage networks. In Indonesia, palm oil companies adopted the test to certify sustainable

sourcing, linking each token to satellite imagery, labor conditions, and environmental impact data. These implementations underscored the medallion’s dual role: as a technical solution and a vehicle for institutional reform. Yet this global integration exposed tensions.
