Yet independent artists continue to challenge this paradigm, using crowdfunding and direct-to-fan models to revive lesser-known versions—each act a subtle reclamation of the score's plural heritage.

Controversies surrounding the score's use persist, particularly regarding cultural appropriation and spiritual commodification. In 2019, a controversy erupted when a major pop artist sampled "O Holy Night" in a secular anthem, prompting backlash from religious communities who viewed the act as sacrilege. Such incidents underscore the ongoing tension between artistic freedom and sacred respect. Looking ahead, the score's evolution will likely accelerate under the pressures of artificial intelligence and immersive technologies. AI-generated renditions—already capable of mimicking the voices of legendary performers—threaten to further fragment authenticity, while virtual reality concerts offer new spatial and sensory experiences. These innovations raise urgent questions: Can a machine-generated performance evoke the same emotional gravity? Does the democratization of creation enhance or dilute the score's cultural meaning?

The long-term implications hinge on how these tensions are navigated. The music, adapted by Adolphe Adam, wove modal melodies reminiscent of Gregorian chant—slow, meditative, imbued with a sense of timelessness—yet infused with Romantic expressivity. This fusion was deliberate: Cappeau and Adam sought to make the divine accessible, not distant. Cappeau’s background as a merchant lent the text a practical, grounded quality. He understood the rhythms of everyday life—the exhaustion of labor, the longing for peace—and infused the hymn with that texture. The score’s structure, with its alternating stanzas of call and response, invited congregational participation, reinforcing

its role as a communal act. Yet even in its sacred setting, the text carried subtext. Its focus on inner revelation, rather than external ritual, subtly challenged institutional rigidity, foreshadowing later reinterpretations in liberation theology. In a France divided by class and faith, Cappeau's hymn became a quiet manifesto. It was first performed on Christmas Eve at Sainte-Cécile, a church in Paris's working-class 6th arrondissement. The choice of location was significant: not a cathedral of power, but a parish church serving artisans and laborers. The audience's mixed reception—some stunned, others skeptical—reflected broader tensions between tradition and modernity. Cappeau's vision, born of personal crisis and social awareness, thus planted the seed for a musical text that would outlive its immediate context.

The African American Reinterpretation: From Spirituals to Civil Resistance

The transformation of "O Holy Night" from French choral hymn to African American spiritual represents one of the most profound cultural transmutations in its history. tone—accompanied speeches and marches, becoming an anthem of hope amid confrontation. The score, once confined to liturgical use, now symbolized a broader spiritual struggle.
