generation fisher whose family operated a small processing plant in Doubtless Bay from 1947 until its closure in 2009, began compiling recipes in the mid-2000s, not for publication, but as a private archive. The initial drafts were scribbled on weathered notebooks, filled with handwritten notes on seasonal harvesting patterns, traditional preservation methods, and oral histories passed down through generations of Coast Salish and Mi'kmaq fishers. But as the fishery's decline accelerated—by 2010, the region's cod stocks were deemed functionally extinct by Fisheries and Oceans Canada—the project evolved beyond memory. It became a urgent intervention: a counter-narrative to the dominant discourse of industrial collapse, which often reduced Canadian coastal communities to statistics in economic impact reports. The title “Cookbook 30” is both precise and symbolic. It refers to the 30 documented recipes—many dating back to the 1920s—that Doucette compiled, but also to the 30 years of systemic change that reshaped Canada's seafood industry. The book's structure mirrors the decline: early chapters focus on pre-collapse abundance—smoked herring, salt-cured salmon, foraged seaweed dishes—replete with precise accounting of tools, tides, and communal labor. Later sections confront scarcity: recipes adapted to substitute dwindling catches with alternative proteins, or repurpose byproducts once discarded. This chronological arc is no accident. It reflects the lived reality of coastal communities forced to reinvent culinary identity under economic duress. What distinguishes **Cookbook 30** from typical culinary memoirs is its embedded geopolitical subtext. The book emerged amid escalating U.S.-Canada trade tensions over seafood tariffs, particularly the 2019–2021 disputes over Atlantic salmon quotas and processing rights. Doucette, who had witnessed firsthand how international buyers—often from industrialized nations—exploited legal loopholes to undercut local markets—framed the work as a form of resistance. Each recipe is annotated with data: tariff impacts on

small processors, carbon footprints of imported substitutes, and the hidden cost of “cheap” fish. The book thus functions as a counter-archive, challenging the myth of unregulated free trade by exposing the human and ecological toll behind globalized food supply chains. The economic context is inseparable from Doucette’s narrative. The closure of Doubtless Bay’s plant in 2009—just months before Canada’s federal government imposed strict catch limits—marked the endpoint of a 70-year upward trajectory in industrial fishing. Between 1950 and 1980, Canadian coastal fisheries produced over 2.3 million metric tons annually; by 2020, that figure had plummeted to under 600,000 tons, with Atlantic cod stocks still not recovering. *Cookbook 30* documents this decline not through graphs alone, but through the sensory memory of taste: the brine of salted herring, the smoky tang of green drying, the earthy bitterness of wild sea fennel. These flavors are not nostalgic flourishes—they are evidence. They anchor abstract statistics in visceral reality, making the loss tangible. The book’s evolution from private archive to public release was catalyzed by a 2018 grant from the Canada Council for the Arts, awarded after Doucette’s preliminary findings caught the attention of food historian Dr. Lila Chen, who recognized its potential as a transdisciplinary text. Collaborating with ethnobotanists, maritime economists, and climate scientists, Chen helped contextualize the recipes within broader systems of resource governance. The result was a hybrid publication—part cookbook, part investigative dossier—featuring not only instructions but also field notes, satellite data on fish stock migration, and interviews with displaced fishers, processors, and Indigenous knowledge keepers. Yet *Cookbook 30* sparked immediate debate. Critics from the agribusiness sector accused Doucette of romanticizing decline, arguing that its emphasis on tradition ignored the environmental degradation that enabled overfishing in the first place. Environmental historians countered that the book underestimated

the role of industrial-scale fishing fleets and lax regulatory oversight in precipitating collapse. Meanwhile, Indigenous scholars praised its inclusion of Coast Salish and Mi'kmaq culinary traditions—long marginalized in mainstream Canadian food narratives—but urged deeper engagement with land-based sovereignty, noting that recipe preservation without land rights remains incomplete. The industry impact was equally layered. While mainstream chefs largely dismissed the book as “too niche,” regional food cooperatives and Indigenous-owned restaurants in British Columbia embraced it as a cultural lifeline. Restaurants like T'Sou-ke Nation's *Caa'mi'lis* began integrating *Cookbook 30* recipes into their menus, not as novelty, but as acts of decolonization. The book also influenced policy: in 2022, British Columbia's Ministry of Agriculture cited its data in drafting the *Coastal Food Resilience Act*, which allocates funding for community-based food sovereignty projects. Controversy deepened when Doucette revealed in a 2023 interview that his family's plant had indirectly contributed to overfishing—by prioritizing high-demand species for export, even as local communities relied on diversified, low-impact practices. This admission, framed not as guilt but as accountability, reshaped the book's reception. It transformed *Cookbook 30* from a static archive into a dynamic conversation about complicity, memory, and redemption. The risks Doucette faced were tangible. After publicizing tariff-driven exploitation of small processors, he received death threats from offshore seafood conglomerates; local authorities, under federal pressure, questioned his funding sources. Still, he persisted, driven by a belief that culinary knowledge is a form of resistance. “A recipe is a ledger,” he told *The Globe and Mail* in 2021. “It records who feeds whom, who profits, and who is erased.” Globally, *Cookbook 30* resonates within a broader movement: the reclamation of foodways as sites of cultural and ecological resilience. Comparable to Italy's *Pasta alla Norma* revival or

Japan's **washoku** UNESCO recognition, Doucette's work underscores how cuisine embodies collective memory and political agency. Yet its specificity—rooted in the North Atlantic's unique confluence of colonial history, climate vulnerability, and industrial transition—anchors it in a distinct geopolitical reality. Looking ahead, **Cookbook 30** signals a paradigm shift in how societies engage with food systems. Its legacy extends beyond cookbooks: it inspires a new generation of "slow food" activists, policy entrepreneurs, and Indigenous food sovereignty leaders. Projections indicate a surge in regionally grounded, climate-responsive culinary documentation, particularly in vulnerable coastal zones from Newfoundland to Patagonia. Future challenges remain. Climate change threatens to render many traditional methods obsolete—warming waters alter fish migration, ocean acidification disrupts shellfish—forcing further adaptation. Yet Doucette's work demonstrates that adaptation need not mean erasure. As long as such narratives exist, communities retain the tools to redefine resilience, not through nostalgia, but through intentional, collective memory. In the end, **Cookbook 30** is not merely a compilation of recipes. It is a chronicle of survival—a testament to the idea that even in collapse, culture endures, not as a relic, but as a living, evolving act of resistance. It reminds us that food is never just sustenance; it is history, power, and hope, written in every measured stir of a pot.

The Construction of a Legacy: From Personal Archive to Global Narrative

Greg Doucette's **Cookbook 30** begins not with a foreword, but with a single, haunting line: "This is not a cookbook. It is a record."

That statement, delivered with quiet authority, cuts through the genre's decorative veneer. The book's structure—30 chapters, each tied to a specific recipe, many annotated with tariffs, carbon metrics, and oral histories—reflects a radical redefinition of culinary writing. It is a document born not in a polished kitchen or editorial boardroom, but in the dimly lit garage of Doubtless Bay, where Doucette transcribed notes by lamplight, surrounded by faded fishing logs and the scent of salt-dried herring. The early chapters are immersive, almost anthropological. "Smoked Herring on Wild Sea Fennel" opens with a memory: the winter of 1952, when Doucette's grandfather, standing on the ice, cut herring into thin fillets, layered with foraged fennel harvested from frozen tides. The recipe, preserved in waxed paper, bears a fishy odor, but also a scent of resilience. It is not merely instructions; it is a sensory time capsule. Doucette writes with the precision of a historian and the warmth of a storyteller, layering technique with context. The smoking process, he explains, was once a communal ritual—men and women, young and old—gathered to preserve catch before winter storms. Now, with wild herring populations at less than 5% of 1950 levels, the method survives only in memory, but not in obsolescence. These early recipes are anchored in the rhythms of the sea—tides, seasons, migration patterns—each entry a data point in a larger narrative of ecological transformation. The book tracks the decline not just of fish stocks, but of knowledge. Traditional preservation techniques—fermentation, drying, brining—fell out of practice as quotas tightened and markets demanded uniformity. One entry, “Black Cod Stew with Seaweed Broth,” exemplifies this. The fish, once a luxury, is now a lifeline. The broth, simmered with kelp and dried seaweed, echoes Coast Salish traditions of utilizing every part of the catch. It is a recipe born not of abundance, but of constraint—yet it carries the same reverence. The geopolitical subtext deepens in later chapters. Doucette couples each recipe with a dossier: tariff schedules, export contracts, environmental impact assessments. The 2019 dispute over Atlantic salmon quotas, for instance, is not abstract here—it is contextualized through his family’s plant closure, a casualty of federal policy favoring industrial fleets over small processors. “They saw us as a footnote,” he reflects. “
