Even in media, the dragon's influence is visible: state-funded platforms deploy hyper-localized content algorithms to shape public opinion, turning information ecosystems into strategic assets. The geopolitical dimension is equally stark. China's Cross-Border Interbank Payment System (CIPS), backed by the People's Bank of China, now competes directly with SWIFT, particularly in regions like Southeast Asia, Africa, and the Middle East. These systems reduce reliance on Washington Consensus institutions and enable parallel financial architectures—each aligned with different power blocs. The result is a de facto bifurcation of the global financial order, where access to liquidity, data, and digital infrastructure has become a new axis of geopolitical leverage. Expert analysis reveals a deeper pattern: the Dragon of the Red Dawn is less a nation-state project than a systemic evolution. International institutions must evolve to regulate algorithmic power, establish norms for data ethics, and prevent a digital arms race.
